Superintendent Report

1. The letter concerning no Saturday Funerals until further notice was sent out to all Funeral Homes. We received no comments or calls concerning this change at the present time.
2. Superintendent Tomsheck started working on the 2023 Cemetery Budget to turn in to the Controller's Office on Friday, June 17th. The Mayor and the Controller will meet with Department Heads after June 17th before going to the City Council.
3. Memorial Day
 - A. Greenwood was cut by the riding mowers seven (7) times plus around the fence line. Greenwood was completely string trimmed one time a week before Memorial Day. GAR Monument, Section S,R,Q and T plus the parade route were given an extra trimming.
 - B. There were 150 Geraniums and small assortment of flowers planted from the Flower Fund.
 - C. The flowers for Greenwood and Swan Lake were planted two (2) weeks prior to Memorial Day, Fifteen (15) flats of flowers planted.
