**AN EXECUTIVE ORDER CONTINUING CERTAIN GOVERNMENT SERVICES
WHILE LIMITING PUBLIC ACCESS TO MICHIGAN CITY GOVERNMENT
BUILDINGS**

WHEREAS, every hour of every day, the situation with the coronavirus in our Country and in our State is evolving, including the unfortunate first coronavirus (COVID-19) related death in the State of Indiana; and

WHEREAS, just this afternoon, the President of the United States, has directed that no more than ten (10) individuals congregate in a group at any given time; and


WHEREAS, among other measures, Indiana Governor Holcomb has closed bars and restaurants in the State of Indiana only allowing for take out or home delivery; and

WHEREAS, due to the ever-changing conditions and closures, which are directed by our state and federal officials, it is necessary for the City of Michigan City, Indiana to take additional proactive measures to protect our workforce as well as the general public.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, I, Duane Parry, Mayor of Michigan City, Indiana, do hereby issue the following Executive Order:

1. Michigan City government buildings, including but not limited to City Hall, Central Services, Central Maintenance, and Cemetery shall be closed to the general public, however, said government buildings will still be open for business and the general public can remotely contact the appropriate City Department either by phone or email. The Sanitary Department, Water Department, and Port Authority are urged to implement similar measures if they have not done so already.
2. The City, by and through each of the respective City Department Heads, will determine employees considered “nonessential” and deploy remote workplace options to ensure continuance of government services as well as the continuation of employee salaries and benefits.
