

2023 Indiana Election Calendar



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This brochure reflects Indiana law as of August 2022. Election law dates are subject to change by the Indiana General Assembly.

This condensed version of the official 2023 election calendar is intended for the use of the general public. **Where your legal rights are invoked, do not rely only on this calendar. Consult your attorney or research the law yourself.**

As used in this brochure "county election board" includes the office of the circuit court clerk, the Lake County Board of Elections and Registration, the Porter County Board of Elections and Registration, and the Tippecanoe County Board of Elections and Registration, unless otherwise indicated.

As used in this brochure "county voter registration office" includes the office of the circuit court clerk and the county board of voter registration in a county where a separate voter registration board has been created.

"Noon" refers to noon, local prevailing time, unless otherwise specified. "Midnight" refers to midnight, local prevailing time, unless otherwise specified.

Monday, August 21, 2023

DEADLINE, for the Democratic, Libertarian or Republican Party to conduct a town nominating convention in a town with a population of less than 3,500.

DEADLINE, by noon, for town council in a town having a population less than 3,500 to file a resolution with the county election board to establish a town election board to conduct the town election.

Monday, August 28, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for filing certificate of nomination from town convention with circuit court clerk for a town having a population less than 3,500.

Monday, September 4, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for the circuit court clerk to file a copy of the certificate of nomination from the town convention with the town clerk-treasurer.

Saturday, September 23, 2023

DEADLINE for county election board to mail absentee ballots to voters who have already filed an approved application with circuit court clerk.

Tuesday, October 10, 2023 VOTER REGISTRATION ENDS

DEADLINE at voter registration office's close of business for a voter to apply to register or transfer registration or at midnight for a voter to complete and submit a voter registration application online.

Wednesday, October 11, 2023

First day that a voter may early vote in the office of the circuit court clerk or satellite office.

Friday, October 13, 2023

End of pre-election campaign finance reporting period.

Thursday, October 19, 2023

First day a confined voter, a voter caring for a confined person at a private residence, or a voter with disabilities may vote an absentee ballot before an absentee voter board at the voter's residence or place of confinement.

Friday, October 20, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, to file pre-election campaign finance reports (including unopposed candidates where no municipal election is conducted).

Thursday, October 26, 2023

DEADLINE, by 11:59 pm, for the circuit court clerk to receive an absentee ballot application from an applicant requesting delivery of a ballot by mail or an application from a voter with print disabilities requesting to vote by mail, email, or fax. Applications may be submitted to the circuit court clerk in person or by mail, fax, email, or online through the Indiana Voter Portal at indianavoters.com.

Saturday, October 28, 2023

Office of the circuit court clerk must be open for at least seven (7) hours to permit early voting. However, in a county with a population of less than 20,000, the county election board may reduce hours to a minimum of four (4) hours on this date. Vote center counties must also have at least one vote center used on Election Day open for early voting, in addition to the office of the circuit court clerk. However, a county election board may adopt a resolution to reduce the days or hours of early voting.

Saturday, November 4, 2023

Office of the circuit court clerk must be open for at least seven (7) hours to permit early voting. However, in a county with a population of less than 20,000, the county election board may reduce hours to a minimum of four (4) hours on this date. Vote center counties must also have at least one vote center used on Election Day open for early voting, in addition to the office of the circuit court clerk. However, a county election board may adopt a resolution to reduce the days or hours of early voting.

Monday, November 6, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for circuit court clerks to receive absentee ballot applications from confined voters or voters caring for a confined person requesting delivery of a ballot by absentee voter board. Applications may be submitted to the circuit court clerk in person or by mail, fax, email, or online through the Indiana Voter Portal at indianavoters.com.

DEADLINE, by noon, for a circuit court clerk to receive Federal Post Card Applications (FPCA) from military/overseas voters requesting to vote by email or fax.

DEADLINE, by noon, for a voter to vote an absentee ballot in the office of the circuit court clerk or satellite office.

DEADLINE for a confined voter, a voter caring for a confined person, or a voter with disabilities to vote an absentee ballot before an absentee voter board at the voter's place of confinement.

Tuesday, November 7, 2023

MUNICIPAL ELECTION DAY

Polls are open 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., prevailing local time.

Tuesday, November 21, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for a candidate to file a verified recount or contest petition.

Friday, December 1, 2023

VOTER REGISTRATION OPENS

Sunday, December 31, 2023

End of annual reporting period for campaign finance reports.

Wednesday, January 17, 2024

DEADLINE, by noon, for all candidate committees, legislative caucus committees, and political action committees to file annual campaign finance reports for 2023.

Wednesday, January 4, 2023

First day a declaration of candidacy for major political party municipal primary nomination may be filed.

First day to file a declaration of candidacy for nomination by a town convention in a town having a population of less than 3,500.

First day an independent or minor party candidate may file a petition of nomination with a county voter registration office for the municipal election for verification of petition signatures.

First day to file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate for the municipal election.

Wednesday, January 18, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for all candidate committees, legislative caucus committees, and political action committees to file annual campaign finance reports for 2022.

Friday, February 3, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, to file a declaration of candidacy for major political party municipal primary nomination.

Friday, February 10, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, to file a withdrawal of candidacy for the primary election.

Wednesday, March 1, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for regular party committees to file 2022 annual campaign finance reports.

Saturday, March 18, 2023

DEADLINE for the county election board to mail municipal primary election absentee ballots to voters who have previously filed an approved application with circuit court clerk.

Monday, April 3, 2023**VOTER REGISTRATION ENDS**

DEADLINE at voter registration office's close of business for a voter to apply to register or transfer registration or at midnight for a voter to complete and submit a voter registration application online.

Tuesday, April 4, 2023

First day a voter may early vote in the office of the circuit court clerk or satellite office.

Friday, April 7, 2023

End of pre-primary campaign finance reporting period.

Thursday, April 13, 2023

First day a confined voter, a voter caring for a confined person at a private residence, or a voter with disabilities may vote an absentee ballot before an absentee voter board at the voter's residence or place of confinement.

Friday, April 14, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for filing pre-primary campaign finance reports for municipal primary candidates (including unopposed primary candidates where no primary is conducted).

Thursday, April 20, 2023

DEADLINE, by 11:59 pm, for the circuit court clerk to receive an absentee ballot application from an applicant requesting delivery of an absentee ballot by mail or an application from a voter with print disabilities requesting to vote by mail, email, or fax. Applications may be submitted to the circuit court clerk in person or by mail, fax, email, or online through the Indiana Voter Portal at indianavoters.com.

Saturday, April 22, 2023

Office of the circuit court clerk must be open for at least seven (7) hours to permit early voting. However, in a county with a population of less than 20,000, the county election board may reduce hours to a minimum of four (4) hours on this date. Vote center counties must also have at least one vote center used on Election Day open for early voting, in addition to the office of the circuit court clerk. However, a county election board may adopt a resolution to reduce the days or hours of early voting.

Saturday, April 29, 2023

Office of the circuit court clerk must be open for at least seven (7) hours to permit early voting. However, in a county with a population of less than 20,000, the county election board may reduce hours to a minimum of four (4) hours on this date. Vote center counties must also have at least one vote center used on Election Day open for early voting, in addition to the office of the circuit court clerk. However, a county election board may adopt a resolution to reduce the days or hours of early voting.

Monday, May 1, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for circuit court clerks to receive absentee ballot applications from confined voters or voters caring for a confined person requesting delivery of a ballot by an absentee voter board. Applications may be submitted to the circuit court clerk in person or by mail, fax, email, or online through the Indiana Voter Portal at indianavoters.com.

DEADLINE, by noon, for a circuit court clerk to receive Federal Post Card Applications (FPCA) from military/overseas voters requesting to vote by email or fax.

DEADLINE, by noon, for a voter to early vote at the office of the circuit court clerk or satellite office.

DEADLINE for a confined voter, a voter caring for a confined person, or a voter with disabilities to vote an absentee ballot before an absentee voter board at the voter's place of confinement.

Tuesday, May 2, 2023**PRIMARY ELECTION DAY**

Polls are open 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., prevailing local time, in certain cities and towns.

Tuesday, May 16, 2023**VOTER REGISTRATION OPENS****Tuesday, May 16, 2023**

First day the circuit court clerk may receive absentee ballot applications from most voters for the municipal election. Applications may be submitted to the circuit court clerk in person or by mail, fax, email, or online through the Indiana Voter Portal at indianavoters.com.

DEADLINE, by noon, for a candidate to file a verified recount or contest petition.

Friday, June 30, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for an independent or minor party candidate to file a petition of nomination with a county voter registration office for verification of petition signatures.

Monday, July 3, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for the Democratic or Republican Party to select a candidate to fill a vacancy on the municipal election ballot due to a vacancy resulting from no candidate being nominated at a primary **and** file a certificate of selection stating that a vacancy on the municipal election ballot resulting from a vacancy on the primary election ballot has been filled.

DEADLINE, by noon, for the Libertarian Party to conduct a convention to nominate candidates for city or large town office or to take action to fill a ballot vacancy following a convention **and** certify candidates nominated at convention or to certify a candidate selected to fill a vacancy following convention

DEADLINE, by noon, to file a declaration of intent to be a write-in candidate at the municipal election.

Monday, July 17, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, for any candidate to voluntarily withdraw from the municipal election ballot.

DEADLINE, by noon, for independent or minor party candidate to file consent of candidate and petition of nomination after county verification of petition signatures (See related entry for June 30, 2023).

NOTE: *The deadlines above are July 15th deadlines under statute that are moved to Noon, July 17th due to the weekend.*

Tuesday, August 1, 2023

DEADLINE, by noon, to file a declaration or withdraw a declaration of candidacy for nomination by a town convention in a town having a population of less than 3,500.

Tuesday, August 8, 2023

DEADLINE, for a town council in a town having a population of less than 3,500 to adopt a resolution to establish a town election board to

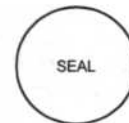

CAMPAIGN FINANCE NOTICE

A candidate's committee must file a pre-primary campaign finance report no later than **NOON, Friday, April 14, 2023**, with the appropriate county election board.

The candidate's committee must also file a pre-primary supplemental report no later than forty-eight (48) hours after the committee receives contributions from a person that totals **\$1,000** or more during the period beginning **April 8,2023 and ending April 30,2023**, with the appropriate county election board. If no such contribution is received, the candidate's committee is not required to file a supplemental report.

A candidate's committee must file a pre-municipal election campaign finance report no later than **NOON, Friday, October 20,2023**, with the appropriate county election board.

The candidate's committee must also file a pre-municipal election supplemental report no later than forty-eight (48) hours after the committee receives contributions from a person that total **\$1,000** or more during the period beginning **October 14,2023 and ending November 5,2023**, with the appropriate county election board. If no such contribution is received, the candidate's committee is not required to file a supplemental report.

A person who fails to file a report with a county election board is subject to a civil penalty of \$50 for each day the report is late, with the afternoon of the final date for filing the report being calculated as the first day, for a maximum penalty of not more than \$1,000, plus any investigative costs incurred and documented by the county election board.

Warning: State law requires that any change in this information be reported within ten (10) person who knowingly files a fraudulent report commits a Level 6 D felony (IC 3-14-1-13). A per accurate report as required by the Indiana Campaign Finance Law commits a Class B mis subject to civil penalties (IC 3-9-4-16, IC 3-9-4-17, and IC 3-9-4-18).

INSTRUCTIONS FOR COMPLETING THIS FORM

This is a dual purpose form. The most common use of this form is to designate a candidate's principal committee in which the candidate is both the chairperson and treasurer. The form enables the candidate to organize and at the same time designate the candidate's principal committee as required by IC 3-9-1-3, IC 3-9-1-4 & IC 3-9-1-5.

The form also allows a person exploring opportunities for seeking a political office but who has not definitely decided to be a candidate for a particular office to organize an exploratory committee. If the candidate is not yet a candidate for a **specific** office, check "exploratory committee" under Section A 3. When the candidate **does** become a candidate for a specific office, an amended CFA-1 must be filed.

The preparer should **type or print legibly in black ink** all information on this form. If more space is needed please attach additional sheets. All versions of State Form 4604 prior to revision (R10/10-01) are obsolete and cannot be used (IC 3-5-4-8). State law requires that any changes on this form must be reported **WITHIN TEN (10) DAYS OF THE CHANGE**.

ITEM 1. IS THIS AN AMENDMENT? Check the appropriate box. If "YES" is checked, enter the file number in the file number box and go on to Section A. If "NO" is checked, proceed directly to Section A.

SECTION A. CANDIDATE INFORMATION: Enter the name of the candidate, as set forth in the candidate's voter registration record and any nickname the candidate uses.

TYPE OF COMMITTEE. See second paragraph above. Be sure to enter the full and current address and the ZIP Code+4, if known. Under party affiliation, enter the party the candidate supports. If no party is supported, enter "Independent." A "Write-In" candidate should follow the same procedure; do not write "Write-In."

OFFICE BEING SOUGHT. Enter the full name of that office. For example, "Indiana State Senator, District _____." *This box is not required to be completed by an exploratory committee.*

SECTION B. COMMITTEE INFORMATION: Do not use any abbreviations in the committee name. Check the new name box if this is a new name. Be sure to enter the full and current mailing address. All correspondence with the committee relative to filings under the Campaign Finance Act will be mailed to this address, unless specified otherwise.

Check the new address if appropriate. Enter the ZIP Code+4, if known, in all boxes calling for the ZIP Code. The date the committee was organized may be the date the candidate publicly announced, filed a declaration of candidacy, solicited or accepted contributions, or made an expenditure. (IC 3-5-2-6)

ITEM 16. COMMITTEES FILING WITH THE INDIANA ELECTION DIVISION ONLY: Committees that file campaign finance reports with the Indiana Election Division and wish to file these reports electronically may contact the Election Division at (800) 622-4941 or at the e-mail address campaignfinance@iec.in.gov for further information.

ITEM 21. Chairperson. This may be the candidate. However, the chairperson may not be the treasurer of any other campaign finance committee except in the case of the candidate's committee. Check if this is a new chairperson or new information.

ITEM 29. Bank or Other Depositories. If a candidate's committee accepts contributions or makes expenditures on an aggregate amount of more than two hundred dollars (\$200) in a year, all funds of a committee must be segregated from, and may not be commingled with, the personal funds of officers, members or associates of the committee. (IC 3-9-2-9)

ITEM 30. Exploratory Committee. Enter a brief statement explaining the purpose of this committee. Example: "To receive and expend funds to explore the opportunities for elected office."

ITEM 31. Salaries and Reimbursements. Pursuant to Indiana Election Commission Advisory Opinion 2001-01, attach a copy of any contract between the committee and the candidate permitting salary and reimbursement payments.

SECTION C. APPOINTMENT OF TREASURER:

ITEM 32. Treasurer. The treasurer must be a U.S. citizen and may not be the chairperson of any other campaign finance committee except in the case of a candidate's committee. The treasurer's duties and responsibilities are discussed in detail in the Instruction Manual for the Indiana Campaign Finance Act (*current edition*). Check if this is a new treasurer or new information. This section must be completed in its entirety by the committee chairperson.

SECTION D. ACCEPTANCE OF APPOINTMENT: The treasurer must provide the treasurer's written signature verifying acceptance of the duties and responsibilities as committee treasurer.

SECTION E. CERTIFICATION OF STATEMENT: The chairperson and candidate must enter their typed or printed names, written signatures and date signed in this section. **Note:** If the candidate and the chairperson are the same only one signature is necessary.
